What changed and why it needs review

The monitored Data Processing Addendum changed the notice period for new subprocessors from 30 days to 7 days. A shorter notice window may reduce the time available for privacy, security, procurement, or legal teams to assess a new service provider and exercise any contractual objection process.

Recommended first review

Confirm whether the shorter window remains compatible with internal assessment, approval, and objection procedures. Route the change to the accountable privacy or vendor-risk owner before drawing a legal conclusion.

Source, timestamps, and fingerprints

Track Changes pairs the clause comparison with source metadata so the reviewer can understand when each version was observed and which normalized content produced the comparison.

Review checklist

1	Contract baseline Identify the notice period, objection right, and approval workflow the business originally accepted.
2	Operational timing Measure whether privacy, security, procurement, and legal reviewers can act inside the new seven-day window.
3	Downstream commitments Check customer commitments or policies that depend on advance notice of subprocessor changes.
4	Record the decision Document the owner, conclusion, action, and any follow-up date in the vendor record.

What this report does - and does not do

COLLECT	Retrieve the submitted public page without credentials or access-control bypass.
NORMALIZE	Reduce formatting noise so the comparison focuses on meaningful text changes.
FINGERPRINT	Create a content hash for each normalized observation.
COMPARE	Preserve before-and-after language and flag review-worthy differences.
ROUTE	Send evidence to the customer-designated business recipient.

Limitations

Public pages can block automated requests, load content dynamically, move URLs, or change in ways that do not produce a reliable comparison. Classification is a triage aid, not a legal conclusion. Track Changes does not guarantee detection of every change and does not replace professional judgment.

Put your highest-risk vendor pages under watch.
